**INVITATION TO BIDS**

1. Cyber Security for Digital Pakistan /nCERT invites bids for “**Establishment of Cyber Operations & Defense Emulation Lab at National CERT**” for which electronic bids are invited under Single Stage-Single Envelope bidding procedure through **e-PADS Version 2.0** from the firms/ companies registered with Income Tax, Sales Tax Departments, which are on FBR’s Active Taxpayer’s List (ATL).
2. The prospective service providers are required to submit their electronic bids including technical and financial proposals along with the Bid Security instrument amounting to Rupees 0.8 million/- (Rupees Eight Hundred Thousand Only) submitted in favor of Project Director, CSDP/NCERT (FTN/NTN: 9012000-7) through PPRA e-PADS Version 2.0.
3. **E-Bidding documents**, containing detailed terms & conditions, specifications and requirements etc. are available on e-Pak Acquisition and Disposal System (EPADS) at <https://vendors.epads.gov.pk/>.
4. Bidder(s) are required to get themselves registered on **EPADS v2.0** on or before **April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2026 11:00 AM**. E-bids will be opened using **EPADS v2.0** on the same day at **April 27<sup>th</sup>, 2026 11:30 AM**. Manual submission of Bids shall not be entertained. Those vendors who have not yet registered on the new version of **EPADS v2.0**, may register themselves on <https://vendors.epads.gov.pk/>. 5. Original Bid security instrument **MUST** be submitted to the undersigned before closing hours of the bid submission time otherwise respective bid will not be opened.
6. Bidding documents can be accessed from the website of National Computer Emergency Response Team (<https://pkcert.gov.pk/>) as well as on PPRA website.
7. Bids will be opened on the same day i.e., **27<sup>th</sup> April, 2026 at 1130 hours** in the presence of representatives of the bidders.
8. As per PPRA Rules 33(1), 2004, National Computer Emergency Response Team (nCERT) has the right to reject any or all bids/ proposals at any time prior to the acceptance of a bid/proposal.

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
