## Pakistan sees decline in militant violence in second straight month

**ISLAMABAD** — Pakistan recorded a second consecutive month of improving security indicators in April 2026, with militant attacks and related casualties declining markedly according to the state released by the Pakistan Institute for Conflict and Security Studies (PICSS) here on Friday.

The Islamabad-based think tank documented 85 verified militant attacks in April, down from 146 in March, a 42 per cent decrease. Fatalities resulting from militant attacks also fell from 136 in March to 68 in April, marking a downward trend that began the period in March when overall combat-related deaths had already dropped by 39 per cent. The improvement follows Pakistan's conclusion of military campaign targeting anti-Pakistan militant groups and Taliban positions between February 25 and March 14, which concluded with a ceasefire and subsequent talks in Doha, Qatar, that the monthly security report released by the PICSS.

The report said that total combat-related deaths including those from militant attacks and security forces operations amounted to 299 in April. Militants are reported to have killed 224 of these

deaths, representing 77 per cent of the total. The remaining casualties included 26 security forces personnel, 27 civilians, and two members of pro-government peace committees.

Losses among security forces personnel declined significantly by killing less than 50 in March to 29 in April, a 53 per cent reduction. Civilian fatalities remained relatively stable, with 17 deaths recorded in April compared to 38 in March. Injuries also showed a notable decline, with all injuries dropped from 219 in March to 111 in April, a 50 per cent decrease. Civilian injuries fell from 90 to 54, while militant injuries declined from 57 to 34. Injuries among security forces personnel decreased slightly from 40 to 46, and no injuries were reported among pro-government peace committee members in April.

The 85 militant attacks recorded during the month were largely low-intensity incidents, with a few exceptions. These included two notable attacks in Balochistan district of Sindh province of Sindh province and a high-profile assault on a training facility operated by National Resources Limited in Chagai district of Balochistan. Despite the drop in attacks, security forces operations sharply fell to an 81 per cent decline, according to PICSS. At the same time, security forces intensified operations in the region, killing 129 militants during the four months of 2026. Notably, higher fatalities occurred in the highest number of militant attacks, followed by Balochistan. It sustained 32 attacks during the month, a 51 per cent increase from 21 in March to 45 in April, while fatalities remained unchanged at 24. The most significant improvement was observed in the tribal districts of FATA, where security forces destroyed 100 militants, a 69 per cent reduction. These attacks resulted in 57 deaths, including 13 linked to the high-profile attack on the National Resources Limited mining facility in Chagai. Security forces killed 60 militants in the province during the month, although this figure was lower than the 145 militants killed there in March.
